G W R R A R I D E R E D U C A T I O N (R E D) P R O G R A M

A brief explanation of the Rider Education (RED) Levels program is provided below. Please see the attached brochure for more information and, as always, you can contact the Chapter Educator for assistance.

The “Rider Ed” Program has four levels:

_ Level I _ “Safety By Commitment”

You may sign up for the Rider Education Program’s Level I at any time. There are no prerequisites or minimums to meet. Simply bring your commitments to make riding safer for you and those with whom you ride.

_ Level II _ “Safety By Education”

To progress to this level, you must have signed on at Level I, achieved at least 5,000 safe miles since becoming a GWRRA member and have taken an approved riding training course (riders) or an approved co-rider training course (seminar or 2-Up riding course) within the past three years.

_ Level III _ “Safety By Preparation”

Certified Tour Rider/Co-Rider

You must be current in Level II, have CPR or First Aid training certification and carry a First Aid kit on your bike.

_ Level IV _ “Safety By Enhanced Preparation and Experience”

Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider

You must be current and have a full year at level III, have ridden no less than 25,000 safe miles since joining GWRRA, and must be certified in both CPR and First Aid. Master Tour Riders and Co-riders sign a commitment to wear all the gear all the time (ATGATT).

All levels require the completion of an application that can be provided by the Chapter Educator or downloaded from the Chapter website or the GWRRA website.

Rider Education Newsletter article --

By the time this goes to press we should have completed the first of, what we hope will eventually be, several PLPs – Parking Lot Practices.

During the process of receiving, and conducting rider training, be it during Basic Rider Course (BRC) or Advanced/Experienced Rider Courses (A/ERC), we have all observed many different techniques on how we each handle those, sometime tricky, slow speed maneuvers. We’d like to provide some insight into what we’ve learned from attending these courses and talking to riding experts; and some of you.

The first thing you must master in slow speed maneuvers is using your head and eyes. This means that wherever you look the bike will go. However, in order to accomplish this both your head and eyes must turn in the direction you want the bike to go. Never look down unless you want to go down, or cross the road’s centerline. This technique does take time to become second nature but you can practice this technique every time you ride. For example, while pulling out of your driveway if you’re going right, turn your head and eyes all the way to the right look down the road where you want the motorcycle to go and you’ll be making a much tighter turn than you previously did. When you stop at an intersection, practice this technique and the bike will go where you want it to go; and you won’t drift over the center line of the road either.

The second technique in slow speed maneuvering deals with the friction zone. This is the area on the clutch between fully open and fully closed. In other words, as you let the clutch out and the bike starts to move, you’re entering the friction zone. An easy way to become accustomed to riding the bike in the friction zone is to practice the slow race; simply ride as slow as you possibly can without releasing the clutch completely.

The third slow speed maneuver technique is the use of the rear or controlling brake. With the motorcycle in the friction zone apply power and keep your foot lightly on the rear brake. This keeps the motorcycle from falling over at low speeds, which is where most people mess up. Don’t believe we’ve ever heard of anyone having problems balancing their motorcycle at normal driving speeds, using front and rear brakes as necessary! Using the front brake at slow speeds, with the handle bars turned even slightly, will cause you to lose your balance and you’ll most likely fall to the ground. Also, when you start to move from a complete stop both feet should come off the ground (don’t drag them) and your right foot should be ready to use the rear brake.

Once you master these three techniques, you will amaze yourself at the maneuvers you can now perform; even the classic U-turn! Remember, all it takes is practice, practice, practice...
